

And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. <sup>5</sup>Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

## Glory to you, O Lord.



### NICENE CREED


## **INVITATION TO COMMUNION**

## COMMUNION

All who believe and are baptized are welcome to receive the sacrament. Put out your hand to receive the wafer. If you need a gluten-free wafer, indicate that need and one will be provided. The wine will be presented in a small glass. If you prefer not to receive the wine – know that "communion in one kind" (just receiving one element: bread or wine) is understood as full participation. Once you have communed, leave your glass in the tray provided. If you need communion brought to you, raise a hand to notify us, and the sacrament will be brought to you.
